Curriculum changes, new programs, etc.

Ms. Drayse-Alonso

- Classes taught this year: Art 7, Studio Art, Printmaking, Sculpture and Independent Study Art.
 - A new emphasis in my art curriculum was to relate lessons closely to sequential learning benchmarks set as a department last July. These benchmarks, guided by the new NYS Standards in the Arts, include the following focused areas of learning: Create and Design, Ethics, Art Careers, Art History and Culture, and Visual Literacy. The Art Department will meet for an R&D day this summer to review and revise our curricula based on this year's findings of our students' experiences and outcomes.
 - Our Printmaking elective included a short Mokuhanga (Japanese woodcut) unit, a first attempt at this upper-level process, and one to be developed further for Printmaking 2020.
 - Along with NYS Visual Arts Standards, Eight Studio Habits of Mind, and the district's new Positivity Project, the spring art show theme, *Portraits*, also steered sequential learning units in all art courses.

Mrs. Marcinko

- The new visual art elective, Digital Art, was a huge success. Students created animations, digital paintings, and illustrations using Sketchbook, Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, and other software. Some comments students wrote about the class were:
 - "I loved the class and experience. I felt was lucky to be able to be there, and I
 appreciated the opportunity the class gives and LOVED the supportive
 atmosphere from the other classmates. This class was overall just amazing and
 I'm so glad I was able to experience it."
 - "This was my favorite class and genuinely the only class I was happy to go to everyday."
 - "I love how positive this class is and what the vibes are like in the class."
 - "The class is good practice if you want to pursue something like this in life."

The final project for this course was an online digital portfolio, where students were required to design a website to show their artwork, both digital and traditional, to use for applying to college or a career. I also collaborated with Sara Pabis and had students to create a series of posters and t-shirt designs for OFA's *Once Upon a Mattress* musical.

 Last summer, the Ogdensburg Art Department met for two Research and Development Days to revisit our curriculum. We updated and redesigned our curriculum to align with the new NYS Visual Arts standards. This was extremely helpful this school year, and we hope to further refine our curriculum this summer.

Mrs. Rycroft

- Grade levels taught this year: Junior Kindergarten- 6th Grade
 - Madill: Days 1, 2, 3 (am), 4 (am)
 - Kennedy: Days 3 (pm), 4 (pm), 5, 6
- My 2018-2019 Elementary Art Curriculum was tailored towards the new department wide benchmarks created after our 2018 summer Research and Development curriculum development meetings. The new benchmarks were a great way to keep student learning consistent across grade levels and schools while also incorporating the new NYS Standards of Art.
- The district introduced the Positivity Project as a new character education program.
 Several art class projects were heavily influenced by the 24 highlighted character strengths.

Special events, projects, interdisciplinary activities, etc.

- The James F. Montpelier Gallery hosted the 4th Annual North Country Art Teachers
 Association Art Teacher Show at the beginning of this year, and will be hosting the 5th
 Annual Art Teacher Show at the beginning of next school year.
- The K-12 Fall Art Exhibit, November 2018, featured the eclectic work of district Art students. The K-12 Spring Art Exhibit, *Portraits*, opened in March, and honored the creative work of over 200 student artists.
- Mrs. Marcinko collaborated with other subject area educators and librarians on interdisciplinary lessons at the elementary level.
- Ms. Drayse-Alonso and Mrs. Marcinko worked with Theater Tech students, Mrs. Pabis and Mr. Lomaki to create props and paint scenery for the musical *Once Upon a Mattress*.
- Ms. Drayse-Alonso's Studio Art students created "Gratitude Portraits" in keeping with one of the character traits of the school district's newly adopted Positivity Project.
- Mrs. Rycroft collaborated with other subject area educators and librarians on interdisciplinary lessons at the elementary level.
- Mrs. Rycroft helped Madill school add color to the garden area. Every student painted a
 rock with a character strength and helped create a "Positivity Rocks" banner to follow
 along with the Positivity Project.
- Mrs. Rycroft created graffiti walls at both Madill and Kennedy with each graffiti word representing a Positivity Project character strength.
- Mrs. Rycroft and Mrs. Marcinko were asked to help to create a yearbook design with students by the K-2 yearbook committee.

Zanaya Baker-Johnson was the featured OFA Senior in this show. This art show features artwork from talented students across St. Lawrence County.
- Gabby Brown (Gr. 12) created the winning cover for the CHMC Foundation Christmas card sent to over 3,000 people.
- Artworks by Zanaya Baker-Johnson, Jada Bishop-Duford, Haley Burlamachi, Kiera Duprey, Nick Mills, Mariah Murphy, Emily Jo Sovie, Andrew Smith, Revé Tomassini, and Carolyn Wright were accepted into the SUNY Potsdam High School Art Exhibit held at the Gibson Gallery in May. Mariah Murphy won the 3D art award.
- Seniors Carolyn Wright and Zanaya Baker-Johnson are the recipients of the OEA Excellence in Visual Art Awards.
- Taylor Pinkerton's (Gr. 6) artwork was requested to be the official image for the Frederic Remington's Harvest Moon event.
- Storm Peccolo (Gr.1) created an image incorporated into the elementary yearbook design at Kennedy School.

Field trips, guest speakers, community involvement.

- MS/HS Art Club and Art 7 students volunteered to paint faces for the *CHMC Festival of the Trees* held in December.

End of Year Report (2018-2019)

On July 31-August 2 Ogdensburg Free Academy, previously approved and recognized by the New York State Education Department as a NYS Certified Agency, offering courses of study in CPR/AED and First Aid knowledge and skills for coaches [meeting the provisions of Education Law 3001(b)(c) and Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, Section 135.5], was the site of the OFA Athletic Department Coaches' Certification Session. All existing members of the certification/re-certification staff are certified as instructors to teach the NYSED approved CPR/AED and First Aid courses for coaches; many members of this highly proficient staff assisted with our annual certification session. Several coaches from Ogdensburg and surrounding communities successfully completed the required objectives and skills evaluations, in accordance with the curriculums of the NYSED and the American Heart Association (AHA).

On August 4 Ogdensburg Free Academy, designated as a "Testing Site" for the NYSPHSAA Section 10 Regional Advance Placement Performance Test (APP Test), was the host location for the Fall Sports Season Session. The OFA Athletic Department organized, coordinated and administered this test, with individual student-athletes from several surrounding school districts attending including: Gouverneur, Hammond, Madrid-Waddington, Norwood-Norfolk, Parishville, Salmon River, St. Lawrence Central, and OFA.

On August 27 and 29 OFA hosted the 25th Annual Girls Soccer Tournament at the Varsity and Junior Varsity levels. Several local schools participated including: Brushton-Moira, Gouverneur, Heuvelton, Lisbon, Madrid-Waddington, Morristown, and OFA.

On August 30 the OFA Varsity Football Team opened their season by competing against Sauquoit Valley High School (Section 3) in the prestigious/coveted *Annual High School Kick-Off Classic* at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, NY.

On September 6 and 8 OFA hosted the 25th Annual Gerard Cring Memorial Boys Soccer Tournament at the Varsity and Junior Varsity levels. Several local schools participated including: Brushton-Moira, Gouverneur, Hammond, Lisbon, Madrid-Waddington, Salmon River, and OFA

On October 27 the OFA Varsity Football team became the Section 10, Class C, Champions and earned a berth to the NYSPHSAA Class C Football Tournament.

On November 2 the OFA Varsity Football team competed in the *NYSPHSAA Class C Football Tournament* First Round/Sub-Regional Playoff game at Plattsburgh High School in Plattsburgh, NY. Our Mighty Blue Devils conquered Section 7 Champions, Saranac Central, (20-7) and advanced in the New York State Tournament Bracket.

On November 9 the OFA Varsity Football team competed in the *NYSPHSAA Class C Football Tournament* Quarter Final ("Elite 8") Playoff game at Potsdam High School in Potsdam, NY. Our Mighty Blue Devils were victorious over Section 2 Champions, Cambridge-Salem (16-6), and advanced in the New York State Tournament Bracket.

On November 17 one member of the OFA Boys Varsity Cross-Country team previously qualified to compete in the *New York State Cross-Country Federation Championships* at Bowdoin Park in Wappingers Falls, NY. (For safety purposes, due to inclement weather/road conditions throughout the state, the meet was cancelled.)

On November 17 the OFA Varsity Football team competed in the *NYSPHSAA Class C Football Tournament* Semi-Final ("Final 4") Championship game at Middletown High School in Middletown, NY. Our Mighty Blue Devils were triumphant over Section 1 Champions, Dobbs Ferry (35-28), and advanced in the New York State Tournament Bracket to the **State Title Game**.
