Budget Presentations

7-8 Budget — We are holding the budget to a 0% increase. The increase in the equipment line from 16-17 for instruments has been carried forward to be used as needed.

9-12 Budget – We are holding the budget to a 0% increase. The equipment line will carry over the increase for instrument replacement from the 16-17 budget to be used as needed.

Buildings and Grounds Budget - The Operations and Maintenance will see an increase in salaries of \$67,000 and the hourly wage increase will be compounded by an increase in minimum wage. Shift differential and overtime will see no increase. Our Electricity and Natural gas lines will see an increase to reflect the economic costs of utilities rising. In addition, there has been 4% added to the Current BOCES expense and can be adjusted when we have our final numbers. The 2022-2023 BOCES Service Request forms are expected to be released in late February.

Athletic Budget – The salaries will see an increase of \$13,000. The \$3,000 increase in Contractual fees are due to contractual obligations, maintenance contracts, and the rising cost of gas. Housed within Materials and Supplies is the continuation of new uniforms to be used only if our budget stays strong and they are needed. Housed within Equipment is the need to purchase new Cheerleader Safety Mats, Swimming Pool Lane Lines and Touch Pads. A 4% increase has been added to the current BOCES contract, this can be adjusted when we receive the BOCES Request for Services with the new amounts.

Transportation Budget – Based on our contracts with First Student we were scheduled to see an 8.25% increase in the upcoming year. Due to switching to our own transportation department we will not see that increase happen and our overall transportation budget is proposed to hold flat. Our transportation schedule will move a majority of our contract transportation funds into district operations.

In other Business Office News

The District has received the Fiscal Stress Scores from the State Comptroller's Office. Below is a chart of our scores for the past 6 years. Our Financial Stress Score has stayed the same at 6.7. The reason for the change from 0 in 2016-2018 to 6.67 in 2019-2021 was spending more money than we received. This is a basic evaluation of our ability to generate enough revenue to meet our expenditures. At year end 2020-2021 our revenue exceed our expenditures, but we still transferred funds from the Debt Service Fund to General Fund to comply with our Tax Cap filing. That must account for the 6.7 Fiscal Score in 2020-2021. The State has made many enhancements to both the fiscal and environmental evaluations by pulling from better data. The Environmental Score decreased from 23.3 to an overall score of 18.3. In the category of Disadvantaged Students based on a 3 year average of our Free & Reduced Lunch percentages, this number remains the same as last year 8.33; the percentage change to 59%. We scored a 10 on Budget Vote Approval which was 75.75% in 2020-2021. (In previous years we scored a 10 on Budget Vote Approval based on 2019 vote which was 62.84%; we scored a 5 with a 68.04% approval based on 2018.) In the category of Turnover Rate of All Teachers we scored 5 in 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. Our Environmental Stress Score has increased by 13 percentage points for Voter Approval and increased 3 for Teacher Turnover. The overall score was 18.3 down from 23.3 last year. The Environmental Score is under no control of the district. Attached is information on the Comptroller's Scoring. For the Financial Stress Score: A summary page listing the financial information the state used in calculating our score; 3 pages of charts showing a comparison between us and the other schools in the NY State and the North Country. The next 3 pages are for the Environmental Score, the 1st page gives information on the breakdown of the score and the next 2 pages are charts comparing us with other NYS schools and the schools in the North Country.




